(formerly Research Network Premodern Russia between Eastern Europe and Asia)

Scholarship on the history of Ukraine, Russia and Belarus is skewed towards recent history The new network aims to pool expertise on the pre-modern period in East European history in order to strengthen and increase the visibility of this area of research. The goal is to broaden the focus of early modern studies by integrating the history of the region into the transnational (or transimperial) and transcultural history of Europe and Eurasia. At the core of this initiative is the question of what significance the epochal changes of the pre-modern period have for our current understanding of Eastern Europe in the modern world.
