Programme

The intensification of Chinese-Russian cooperation in the wake of Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine has increasingly brought into focus the fact that Eastern Europe and East Asia are commonly referred to as the »East«. Against the background of current debates about a changing world order, the GWZO's lecture series »East to East« explores, in close cooperation with Leipzig University (ReCentGlobe, Institute for East Asian Studies), historical entanglements between Eastern Europe and East Asia. Invited international scholars address economic and intellectual perspectives as well as perspectives from the history of science, while also looking beyond Sino-Soviet/Russian relations.

The opening and closing panel discussions address the question of whether current shifts should be understood as deglobalisation and the emergence of new blocs, or rather as a new phase of trans-regional exchange under changed conditions.
