In a joint appointment procedure with the Leibniz Institute for the History and Culture of Eastern Europe (GWZO) e.V., Leipzig University seeks to fill the following professorship from **1 April 2022**:

W2 Professorship in Cultural History of Eastern Europe

(Successor to Professor Stefan Troebst)

connected with the position of Deputy Director of the GWZO

The professorship is assigned to the Global and European Studies Institute at the Faculty of Social Sciences and Philosophy. Here, the professorship is connected with the direction of the MA programme in European Studies and with active membership in the Graduate School Global and Area Studies. It is expected that the subject of European Cultural History will be represented as comprehensively as possible on the Institute's master's programme and the Graduate School's PhD programmes. The successful applicant will be expected to actively participate in the interdisciplinary investigation of historical and current positioning strategies of societies in Eastern Europe in and towards global and transregional processes and structures, both in the Leipzig Research Centre Global Dynamics and the Central German Forum for the Study of the Global Condition. Accordingly, a teaching and research profile covering the history of Eastern Europe, with a focus on the history of the 18th to 21st centuries, is expected. The professorship's teaching commitments on the study programmes at the Faculty of Social Sciences and Philosophy are 2-4 hours per week per semester.

The GWZO researches the historical and cultural development processes in the region between the Baltic, Black and Adriatic Seas in a comparative perspective. The wide geographical scope of its research programme requires a special research approach that combines comparative studies, interdisciplinarity and transnationality, and which also takes into account the entire historical depth from the transition from antiquity to the Middle Ages to the present. The Deputy Director supports the management of the Institute. They play a decisive role in the long-term development and orientation of the research programme and are expected to have outstanding skills in research and management, the ability to develop human resources, and to promote scientific talent. In addition to a good knowledge of regional languages, a willingness and ability to engage in interdisciplinary national and international cooperation as well as visible success in raising external funding and transferring research results into society, culture and politics are key prerequisites.

The appointment is based on the Jülich model of joint appointments, as agreed between Leipzig University and the GWZO. The professorship will be filled indefinitely, while appointment as Deputy Director is limited to five years, with reappointment possible.

What we offer

The job holder's rights and obligations are regulated by the Saxon Freedom of Higher Education Act (SächsHSFG) and the Saxon Service Regulations for Higher Education Institutions (DAVOHS). Applicants must meet the requirements of Sect. 58 SächsHSFG.

Leipzig University is committed to gender equality.

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Purpose and legal basis of the processing of personal data:

Any data you provide us with in connection with your application will be processed only for the purposes of this selection process and, where appropriate, in preparation for your employment. The legal basis of the processing of your personal data for appointing civil servants/for employment-related purposes is Art. 6(1) Sentence 1(e) in conjunction with (3), Art. 88 GDPR in conjunction with Sect. 111(6) of the Saxon Civil Servants Act (SächsBG) in conjunction with Sect. 4(1) Sentence 1 of the Saxon Data Protection Act (SächsDSG), and Sect. 26 of the German Federal Data Protection Act (BDSG). Insofar as you provide special categories of personal data during the application procedure within the meaning of Art. 9(1) GDPR (e.g. data concerning health, such as severely disabled status), that data will be processed so that you can exercise your rights in the field of employment and social security and social protection law and so that the controllers can carry out their obligations in this regard under employment and social welfare law (Art. 9(2)(b) GDPR).

Disclosure to third parties:

Your application documents will be made available to the members of the appointment committee, which is composed of representatives of Leipzig University and the GWZO, the participating Equal Opportunity Commissioner, the Disability Officer(s) if involved, the appointment officer, external assessors, the Rectorate, the Faculty Council, the Faculty and University administration, the Saxon State Ministry of Science, Culture and Tourism, representatives of the GWZO and GWZO Supervisory Board.

Personal data storage period:

The duration of the storage of personal data is governed by Sect. 11(4) of the Saxon Data Protection Implementation Act (SächsDSDG). Obligation to provide data:
